## TEACHING FACULTY

The morning shift of the college, in addition to the officiating principal, has a total of 64 lecturers appointed on a regular basis, out of which 29 lecturers are Doctorates and 17 are M. Phil. in their respective subjects. To cater to the educational needs of the students, 3 professors are also appointed as guest faculty. A well-stocked and meticulously arranged library administered by a Senior Librarian is easily accessible to facilitate and encourage reading habits among the students.

As for the evening shift, the staff comprises of 6 lecturers appointed on a regular basis, out of which 4 lecturers are Doctorates and 1 is M. Phil. in their respective subjects. It is only with the dedication, cooperation and able guidance of the staff members that the college continues to work for the overall development of the students.

## BURSAR

In any organization, effective and efficient management of government funds is essential and extremely vital. The bursar must be knowledgeable, versatile, optimistic and able to take quick decisions. Dr. D.K. Tyagi took up this critical role for the current session succeeding Dr. Ramesh Chandra Sharma of the Mathematics department after his retirement and is performing his duties in a responsible manner.

Sharma (Department of Commerce), Dr. Shiv Hari (Department of Mathematics), Dr. Satya Kheda (Department of

Economics) retired from the college having contributed immensely to its progressive functioning.

#### EXTENSION OF BUILDING

The college got the departmental approval for the financial budget of Rs. 19.8 lakhs for the construction of a couple of new rooms during the session. The construction of a new building for the library and an auditorium are also under consideration.

#### LIBRARY

No educational institution is complete without a refined library in it. Referential material along with the prescribed syllabus fulfills the purpose of educating students. Especially in graduation courses where the worldview of the students is set to build and establish for life, library offers the multitude of perceptions and analysis of the same subject that is required. With the number of books that can be an asset for a student's journey, library offers a free space for the students to dive in and progress academically and overall, at their own speed. The college houses an easily accessible library to facilitate learning and cultivate reading habits among students. The computerized library of Govt. College Faridabad is fully equipped in helping students and staff members to enhance their knowledge and make themselves better. Currently, the library has 45,356 books in various subjects and 5,037 books are in the book bank for poor children. Students can access these books throughout the year as per library policies under the supervision of senior librarian Dr. Usha Arora.

The library is equipped with a reading room as well where a total of 12 national and regional newspapers along with 13 magazines and journals are provided regularly. The provision for free internet facility for students and staff members has also been made in the library.

To support and enhance the institute's library, a government grant of Rs. 3 lakhs were provided, out of which 764 course related books were purchased with an amount of Rs. 2,48,771/-. The remaining amount of Rs. 51,229/- was kept to purchase inventories for which the permission could not be obtained by the department in time. Therefore, this amount was left unused.

Although the college library experiences a lack of space yet it constantly strives to extend its services for the welfare of the students.

## STELLER ACHIEVEMENTS

Like preceding years, our college students have continued to bear the torch of success and glory in various fields this year.

- ❓ **NSS:** It is a matter of great pride for the college that in the year 2015-16, Rajneesh Singh was awarded the 'Indira Gandhi National NSS Award' by *His Excellency the President of India* for his outstanding work in the field of NSS.
- ❓ **Academics:** In this session, one of our students, Shivani Chaudhary (B.A. English, IV Semester) secured the tenth position in the merit list of the university.
- ❓ **Cultural Activities:** Brilliant results at Zonal and Inter-Zonal Youth Festival.
- ❓ **Sports:** Amar Atri won Gold medal in pistol shooting at inter-college level, sixth place at All India College level and Gold medal at National Level.

College students Sadaf and Dushyant participated in District Level Science Quiz sponsored by Haryana State Council for Science and Technology held in the college premises.

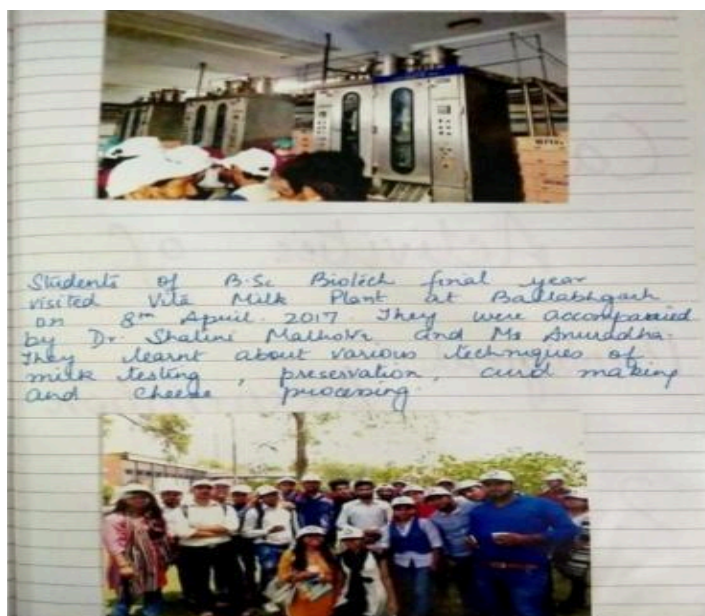

Aarohan addresses one of the most important components of Education for Empowerment Programme of Action. The National Policy on Education envisioned the creation of Women

Studies and Development Cells in all colleges of Haryana, which will work towards creating awareness and empowerment initiatives for girl students.

Aarohan organizes year-round activities of various kinds to give the girl students exposure, training and opportunities to grow into confident and responsible citizens of our country. These programmes are aimed at:

- Creating awareness
- Imparting skills
- Providing opportunities

Keeping in mind the above mentioned aims, the following activities were organised during the session.

**Aaghaaz, a cultural festival was organized on September 29, 2016:** Bharatnatyam and Folk Dance 'Des Rangila' were highlights of this festival which also featured Extempore and Poster making competitions on women empowerment related topics. A short street play on the theme of '*Beti Bachao-Beti Padhao*' was also presented which was highly appreciated by the audience.

An extension lecture was organized on the theme of Personality Development, where Dr. Anita Rathi, Officiating Principal, Government College, Kosli, spoke on various aspects of personality development through confidence building, better time management, taking care of one's health and nutrition et cetera.

The day ended with prize distribution by Dr. Anita Rathi and Principal Smt. Bimla Vishnoi. More than 100 students participated in the festivities.

### **Fine Arts Training to Girls:**

Aarohan organised a two-week Fine Arts Training Camp for girl students in the month of September, where they were coached in Basket Weaving, Mehendi, Rangoli, Sketching, Painting, and Photography et cetera.

**Workshop on Women Empowerment on October 4, 2016: This workshop was organised in collaboration with a local NGO "Nari Utthan: Shiksha se Sashaktikaran".**

Dr. Archana Bhatia, President of this NGO and Faculty, Department of Commerce, D.A.V. Centenary College, Faridabad, addressed the girls on becoming women of substance. A Guinness Book Record holder and a recipient of many awards, Dr. Bhatia also addressed the issues of female foeticide, gender bias, health and nutrition, self-empowerment through education, among many others. The issues of misuse of technology among girls, layers of discrimination towards girls in various aspects of life were also discussed in depth and detail.



The discussions were off the beaten track and were remarkable for clear insight and perspective on definitions of empowerment, self-respect and responsibility towards self.

**Dr. Puneeta Hasija** spoke on the need to be alert about timely vaccination, women's reproductive disorders, cervical cancer and breast cancer et cetera. She emphasized women's responsibility towards their own health.

**Mrs. Alka Chawla** spoke on '**Women's Economic Empowerment**'. She said that financial independence was not a compulsion but a mark of self-respect. **Writer and social activist Mrs. Ashima Kaul made the girls aware of the double standards in society** and recited a most inspiring poem on the need to break down these patterns of discrimination. She exhorted the girls to play an aware and positive role towards building a harmonious environment in society.

The workshop created a lively and participatory atmosphere through question-answers. Dating, precautions while going out with friends, and establishing a relationship of trust with parents also came up during the discussion. The workshop ended on a message of new beginnings to the girls.

The NGO also gave a **Merit Scholarship** of Rs.3000/- each to 3 girls. A Street Play, '*Beti ka Maan-Rashtra Samman*' was presented on this occasion. About 100 students watched this enactment and strengthened the chain of inspirational communication.

**Film Show for Girls:** A special film show of the Aamir Khan starrer 'Dangal' was arranged for girls on January 14, 2017, by the local MLA Sh. Vipul Goel. 131 girls accompanied by teachers attended the screening.

**Yoga & Meditation Camp:** Yogacharya and Life-style Guru, Archana Sharma conducted a Yoga and Meditation Camp on February 9, 2017. 50 girls and women teachers attended this camp where most important Yoga *Asanas* were performed under supervision. This was followed by a short meditation session.

Important *Asanas* related to women's reproductive system, digestive system, and *Pranayam* were performed and Archana ji circulated among the girls, correcting posture, breathing method and movement patterns. An important part of this camp was the Q-A session in which the girls were told about *Asanas* to address issues like hairfall, thyroid dysfunction, anaemia, unnatural weight-gain as well as unnatural weight-loss.

*Pran-kriyas* were performed, accompanied with relevant mantra-recitation.

**YUGANTAR: Join Hands for Change: The 2-Day Inter-college Festival of Awareness and Empowerment on February 17, 2017:**

**This year, Yugantar: Join Hands for Change** was focused on renewing the pledge towards positive change and affirmative action. Though Aarohan could not invite the fellow colleges for the celebration, and the festival had to accommodate grant constraints, the spirit and the verve behind the festival was very much evident. Carrying forward the theme of working together to end gender bias and discrimination, the street play **Yeh Deewar Tootati Kyon Nahi!!** highlighted right choices and right action to end discrimination.

**International Women's Day (March 8, 2017):**A seminar was organised in the Life Sciences department, on the theme of '*Women on Top: Challenges and Opportunities*'. Nisha and Jyoti of B.Sc. I (Medical) spoke on the need for women to change their own mindset. Dr. Kamna Hooda, Dr. Tarun Arora, Dr. Arun Lekha and Mrs. Sushila Devi spoke on various aspects of womanhood. The seminar was presided over by Principal, Smt. Bimla Vishnoi, and moderated by Dr. Neer Kanwal. The seminar was followed by a cultural programme, with dancing and singing as the main attraction.

**Besides these activities, periodic counselling, medical-aid, and short-term computer training in basics of DTP were provided as per need.**

## **OUR NEEDS**

1. There is an absolute need to get the boundary walls of the college elevated for the safety and security of the students.
2. Our college is the largest college in the city and yet the campus lacks a proper auditorium. It is the need of the hour that a well-equipped auditorium is built in the college compound.
3. In the year 1971, the college started with only 400 enrolled, which has now increased to 4911. In addition to a new building, the present building is almost 40 years old and needs proper repairs, details of which have been sent to the P.W.D.
4. There is no adequate provision for the washrooms in the college compound. Considering the number of students enrolled for the current session, at least a total of ten toilets for male students, four for girl students and ten toilets for staff are needed urgently.
5. A whole new science block is required with 20 separate laboratories assigned to the subjects of Psychology, Chemistry, Physical, Biology, Botany and Geography.
6. The Principal's residence in the college campus is in a very poor condition. It should be rebuilt so that this housing facility can be made use of.
7. There is also a need to provide housing facility for the college staff (Teaching faculty) within the college compound.



8. So far in the evening shift of the college, the students have the option to opt for the traditional courses in the Arts and Commerce streams at graduation level. To fulfill the need of the present times, the classes for B. B. A. And M.B.A. should also be offered in the evening shift.
9. Despite being the largest college in the Faridabad region, there is no women's hostel in the campus. It has been a constant demand of girl students coming from rural areas. A proposal to this effect has been sent to the University Grants Commission.
10. The number of girl students in the college is continuously increasing but there is lack of adequate space for them to sit. Therefore, a reasonably spacious common room is required.
11. There is an acute shortage of regular professors in the college and the work is being done by visiting faculty. Regular appointments should be made as per the requirement of the college to fill the vacant posts in departments of Hindi, Chemistry, Physics, Commerce, Economics, Psychology, History, Botany, Computer Science etc.
12. There is an acute shortage of non-teaching staff in our college, with only one clerk in the morning shift. The establishment branch needs more staff to maintain and update records properly.

### Library

The library opens daily from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for the enhancement of students' knowledge and is fully capable of providing facilities for students to study. Presently, the library has 44,578 books of various subjects and 5,037 books are in the Book Bank. From here, students and staff receive books as per library rules. This rich library is headed by Dr. Usha Arora. This library is divided into undergraduate and postgraduate sections. Students of postgraduate classes can get 5 books issued at a time and students of under graduate classes can get 3 books issued. In addition, meritorious and financially weak students can get books for the whole year. The library is partially automated.

There is a provision of E-library wherein students and staff can avail free internet service. A separate section has been created in the library where new book versions of all the subjects purchased are kept for one year. 13 magazines and 13 newspapers are subscribed in the library. Related books are available in this college under the placement cell for students appearing in competitive examinations. Photostat facility is available in the library. During the session 2015-2016, Government grant of ₹ 3,00,000 was received from government treasury, out of which five book cases worth ₹ 36,765 and 779 books of various subjects worth ₹ 2,63,235 have

been purchased by the college. We are constantly striving for prosperity and strengthening of library and library services.

The present library was built as per the requirements of 1971. At that time the number of students and books were very less. At present there are 50,000 books in the library and the college needs a full-fledged library block.

- **One Act Play in Hindi “Quissa Bharat Milap” garnered much appreciation and won First Prize in Inter University North Zone Youth Festival 2015-16 held at P.A.U. Ludhiana. The play also won the Second Prize in National Youth Festival 2015-16 held at Mysore University, Mysore. This singular achievement is covered in the picture gallery.**
- **The college also had the distinct honour of hosting the Zonal Youth Festival of M.D. University, Rohtak.**
- **It is a matter of pride for the college that our student Jai Chowdhary was selected for Pre Republic-Day Camp held in M.D.U. Rohtak on September 3, 2015.**
- **Noted sociologist and social activist Ms. Gunjan Sharma conducted a two-day workshop on September 29-30, 2015 on Gender Sensitization “GENDER WOHI, SOCH NAYI” unique in its approach and methodology.**

### **Student Feedback**

The college has been following the informal method of gathering feedback from the students, on syllabus, teaching-learning process and whether the syllabi is completed in time et cetera. This time, it was decided to undertake a random sample survey to gauge the student responses

in the classes of B.Sc. B.C.A., B. Com, B.A. and B.B.A. If the survey proved helpful, similar exercises could be undertaken on a bigger scale and other areas of college life. In many cases, the students did not spend much time thinking on the questions, and some were quite casual about the whole exercise.

*But it was heartening to note that about 50% of the students spent time and thought on the questions, and wanted to talk about their needs. We felt that the students needed to be heard more, and more platforms needed to be provided to facilitate an open exchange of ideas and opinions.*

## **Sports**

Sports are an integral part of our lives. They enable the students to learn the importance of having healthy mind in a healthy body. Along with education our students have made an indelible mark in the field of sports. It is a result of sheer hard work and dedication that whenever students participate in any event, they bring laurels to the college. This year also our college sportspeople have made remarkable achievements in University, State and National level competitions which are listed below.

**Kabaddi (HS):** The college team of Kabaddi (Haryana Style) has won second place in Maharishi Dayanand University, Rohtak for third consecutive year. The captain of college team Amit Sharma of MA (P) and Mohit of BA I represented MDU at All India University level. This competition was held in Kurukshetra University in the month of March. Sh. Balbir Singh Daliya, Assistant Professor in Physical Education has himself been a player at international level accompanied the team to Kurukshetra University as Team Manager.

**Kabaddi (NS):** The college team participated in Inter college competition held at MDU, Rohtak and also reached semifinals at Dronacharya College, Gurugram, which were organised by Higher Education Department from 17 to 21 March 2016.

**Judo:** Deepak Hudda, a student of BA second year bagged the second position in MDU, Rohtak in 73 Kg weight category.

**Cricket:** The boys' cricket team won the second prize in Inter college competition Gurgaon zone held at Dronacharya Government College, Gurgaon.

**Powerlifting:** Our college student Pramod of MA final won gold medal in MDU, Rohtak in powerlifting (boys).

**Air Rifle Shooting:** Our college team consisting of Amar Singh, Sumit and Ashwini Yadav, won the third place in Inter College Competition.

**Wrestling:** Our wrestlers won five medals at University level this year in freestyle and Greco Roman style. Wajib Khan of BA II in 74 kg weight category and Rohit of BA II in 125 weight category won third place in freestyle. In Greco Roman wrestling Pawan and Pradeep bagged third position in 59 Kg and 65 Kg weight category respectively. Wajid Kahan can got first position in 75 weight category.

**Athletics:** This year Annual Sports meet of Maharishi Dayanand University, Rohtak was held at CRA, College, Sonapat. Ten students of our college participated in this event. Narendra Kumar of BA first year got third position in high jump. Kapil of BA first year and Sanjay of BA second year got II and III prize respectively in 10000 meters.

Besides this our students also showed commendable performances in Cross Country Chess and Taekwondo. Inter class competitions were also held to encourage the students. Friendly matches of Cricket and Kabaddi are also held between the teams of different colleges so that the maximum students can participate.

Sushila thanked Ms. Gunjan and Aarohan for this unique workshop and promised that such workshops would continue to focus on gender issues in meaningful ways.
- ☐ Advocate Mrs. Durgesh Bakshi addressed a mixed group of students **on Legal Rights of Women** on October 8, 2016. Domestic Violence Act, Dowry Prohibition, Equal Share in Parental Property were some of the important Acts discussed in the extension lecture. Boys were as curious about the provisions in these acts and asked for advice in cases where their sisters or women relatives were suffering. It was a fruitful session in terms of creating awareness and engaging our students in a discussion on the factors which necessitated such laws.
- ☐ One-month **Self Defence Training** programme, an annual feature of Aarohan was started in the month of October and concluded in time for participation in the Annual Athletic Meet of the college.
